

"I HAVE A CALLING" 21 DAYS OF FASTING:
A Devotional Journey Based on "I Have A Calling"

DAY 1: THANKSGIVING.

Book Reflection:

BEFORE YOU WERE BORN, GOD WROTE YOUR STORY

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart."

These words from Jeremiah 1:5 are not just beautiful poetry—they're the foundation of your entire existence. God didn't create you and then figure out what to do with you. He knew exactly who you would be and what you would do before you took your first breath.

Your calling is not something you create or discover by accident. It's something God wrote in a book before the foundation of the world. Psalm 139:16 says, "Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." This means your life has divine intentionality. You are not a cosmic accident. You are a divine appointment.

Scripture Reading:

Jeremiah 1:5 (NIV)

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."

Psalm 139:13-16 (NIV)

For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be."

Day 1: Thanksgiving Prayer Points.

1. Thank God for your divine design.
2. Thank God for the victories and even battles of 2025.
3. Thank God for our church, Impact Church, our pastors and leaders, our community.

Thanksgiving for Divine Design: Father, I thank You that before I was born, You knew me. Thank You that my calling is not an accident but a divine appointment written in Your book before the foundation of the world. I praise You for the intentionality with which You created me and designed my purpose. I am not a mistake—I am a masterpiece with a mission.

Prayer for Pastors and Spiritual Leaders: God, I lift up my pastors and spiritual leaders before You today. Thank You for the calling You've placed on their lives to shepherd us Your people. Give them fresh revelation of their own calling and renewed strength to fulfill it. Anoint them with wisdom, courage, and supernatural grace as they lead us into our destinies. Protect them from discouragement and surround them with Your favor.

DAY 2: THANKSGIVING

Book Reflection:

YOU ARE FEARFULLY AND WONDERFULLY MADE

When David wrote "I am fearfully and wonderfully made," he wasn't just being poetic—he was declaring a profound theological truth. The Hebrew word for "fearfully" means "with great reverence and respect." God made you with such care, such precision, such intentionality that it should inspire awe. You are not mass-produced. You are custom-designed.

Everything about you—your personality, your experiences, your strengths, even your weaknesses—has been woven together by God for a specific purpose. You are a rare and priceless commodity. There has never been another you, and there will never be another you. Your uniqueness is not accidental—it's essential to your calling.

Scripture Reading:

Psalms 139:13-14 (NKJV) - "For You formed my inward parts; You covered me in my mother's womb. I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; marvelous are Your works, and that my soul knows very well."

Ephesians 2:10 (NIV) - "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

Day 2: Continue in Thanksgiving:

1. Thank God for your calling.
2. Thank God for the Holy Spirit, anointing and grace to fulfill your calling.
3. Thank God for establishing Impact Church and its mission.

Thanksgiving for Unique Design: Lord, I thank You that I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Thank You that every detail about me—my personality, my gifts, my experiences—has been intentionally designed for my calling. I reject every lie that says I'm not enough or that I'm too much. I celebrate the way You made me because it's exactly what's needed for my assignment.

DAY 3: REPENTANCE AND CLEANSING THROUGH THE BLOOD OF JESUS.

Book Reflection:

Sin contaminates everything it touches—including your calling. Like one drop of sewage in a swimming pool, sin doesn't stay isolated; it spreads and poisons every area of your life. But repentance is God's cleansing agent that purifies your calling and restores you to your original assignment. When you repent, you're not just saying sorry—you're being washed, renewed, and repositioned for what God called you to do.

Scripture Reading:

Psalms 51:10-12 (NKJV)

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence, and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation, and uphold me by Your generous Spirit."

1 John 1:9 (NKJV)

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Acts 3:19 (NKJV)

"Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord."

Isaiah 1:18 (NKJV)

"Come now, and let us reason together," says the LORD, "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall be as wool."

Prayer Points:

1. Repent and confess your known sins and unknown sins to God.
2. Pray and ask God for complete cleansing and purification through the blood of Jesus.
3. Declare and speak total restoration over your life and calling in Jesus name.

Confessing Specific Sins That Have Contaminated Your Life and Calling: Father, I come before You with a humble and contrite heart. I confess every sin that has contaminated my calling—every compromise, every hidden sin, every area where I've allowed darkness to creep in. I confess pride, lust, greed, unforgiveness, bitterness, jealousy, and every work of the flesh that has polluted the assignment You gave me. I name these sins specifically before You now, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I don't want to carry this contamination any longer. Cleanse me, Lord. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity and purify me from my sin. Let the blood of Jesus remove every stain, every spot, every blemish from my calling. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Asking for Complete Cleansing and Purification: Lord, I ask for complete cleansing—not partial, not surface-level, but deep, thorough, and total purification. Create in me a clean heart, O God. Renew a right spirit within me. Wash me with hyssop and make me clean. Purge me and make

me whiter than snow. I don't want any residue of sin left in my life. I want to be completely clean so that I can walk in the fullness of my calling without hindrance, without shame, without guilt. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation. Let me feel the freedom that comes from being completely forgiven and completely cleansed. I receive Your cleansing right now by faith. I am washed. I am clean. I am pure. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Declaring Restoration Over your Life: Father, I declare that my life is now cleansed and restored. Every area that was contaminated by sin is now purified by the blood of Jesus. I am qualified by Your grace. I am no longer stained—I am washed white as snow. I am no longer hindered—I am free to walk in the fullness of my assignment. I declare that times of refreshing are coming from the presence of the Lord. I declare that my calling is now operating in purity, power, and purpose. I will fulfill everything You've called me to do with a clean heart, clean hands, and a clear conscience. I am restored. I am renewed. I am ready. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen and Amen.

DAY 4: REPENTANCE FOR ALIGNMENT.

Book Reflection:

When you drift from obedience, you drift from your calling. King Saul started well but disobedience pulled him off course until God removed the kingdom from him. Repentance is not just about feeling sorry—it's about turning around and getting back on the path God ordained for you. Every time you repent, you're course-correcting, realigning, and repositioning yourself for your divine assignment.

Scripture Reading:

2 Chronicles 7:14 (NKJV)

"If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."

James 4:8-10 (NKJV)

"Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded. Lament and mourn and weep! Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom. Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up."

Joel 2:12-13 (NKJV)

"'Now, therefore,' says the LORD, 'Turn to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning.' So rend your heart, and not your garments; return to the LORD your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness; and He relents from doing harm."

Revelation 2:5 (NKJV)

"Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly and remove your lampstand from its place—unless you repent."

Prayer Points:

1. Repent and acknowledge to the Lord the areas in your life where you have drifted.
2. Pray and ask God to give you the grace and discipline to turn away from the wrong path.
3. Pray for direction for our church. That the Lord will lead our pastors and leaders and give them the heart to go into the right direction.

Identifying Where You've Drifted from Your Calling: Lord, I ask You to show me where I've drifted from the path You set for me. Where have I compromised? Where have I taken shortcuts? Where have I allowed disobedience to pull me off course? Show me the areas where I've been walking in my own wisdom instead of Yours, where I've been pursuing my own agenda instead of Your will. I don't want to be like King Saul—starting well but ending badly. I want to finish strong. So I ask You now: Where have I fallen? Where have I strayed? Reveal it to me clearly so I can repent and return. Search me, O God, and know my heart. Try me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me back to the everlasting way. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Turning Back to God's Original Path: Father, I repent. I turn away from every path that is not Yours. I turn away from disobedience, from compromise, from self-will, from pride. I turn back to You with all my heart, with fasting, with weeping, with mourning. I rend my heart and not my garments. I humble myself before You and ask You to realign me with the calling You gave me. Put me back on the path You ordained before the foundation of the world. Restore me to the assignment You gave me. I don't want to drift any longer. I want to walk in the center of Your will, in the fullness of Your purpose, in the power of Your Spirit. Draw near to me as I draw near to You. Lift me up as I humble myself before You. Realign my steps with Your divine plan. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Asking for Divine Course Correction: Lord, I ask for divine course correction. Redirect my steps. Reposition me for my calling. Remove every obstacle that I created through disobedience. Restore every opportunity that I lost through compromise. Heal every relationship that I damaged through sin. I declare that I am back on track. I am realigned with Your will. I am repositioned for my assignment. I will not drift again. I will stay close to You. I will obey Your voice. I will walk in Your ways. I declare that my calling is now fully aligned with Your purpose, and I will fulfill everything You've called me to do. Thank You for Your mercy. Thank You for Your grace. Thank You for course-correcting me and bringing me back to the path of life. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen and Amen.

DAY 5: PRAYING FOR HOLINESS THROUGH THE BLOOD.

Book Reflection:

Holiness is not just about being "good"—it's about being protected. Like a firewall protects a computer from viruses, holiness protects your life and calling from the contamination of sin. King Saul lost his calling because he compromised. Samson lost his strength because he compromised. But Joseph kept his calling because he ran from compromise. Holiness isn't legalism—it's obedience and wisdom. It's building walls around your calling so the enemy can't get in.

Scripture Reading:

Hebrews 12:14 (NKJV)

"Pursue peace with all people, and holiness, without which no one will see the Lord."

1 Peter 1:15-16 (NKJV)

"But as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, because it is written, 'Be holy, for I am holy.'"

Proverbs 4:23 (NKJV)

"Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life."

1 Thessalonians 4:3-7 (NKJV)

"For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you should abstain from sexual immorality; that each of you should know how to possess his own vessel in sanctification and honor, not in passion of lust, like the Gentiles who do not know God; that no one should take advantage of and defraud his brother in this matter, because the Lord is the avenger of all such, as we also forewarned you and testified. For God did not call us to uncleanness, but in holiness."

Prayer Points:

1. Make a fresh commitment to the Lord to walk in holiness.
2. Ask the Lord to expose and reveal to you areas where there has been compromise.
3. Pray for the spirit of holiness to rest upon our entire church.

Building Walls of Holiness Around Your Calling: Father, I commit to building walls of holiness around my calling. I will guard my eyes from what they should not see. I will guard my mind from thoughts that don't honor You. I will guard my relationships from ungodly entanglements. I will guard my entertainment choices, my social media consumption, my conversations, and my associations. I refuse to give the enemy any access point into my life or my calling. I will not compromise in the small things because I know that small compromises lead to big consequences. I set boundaries around my life—not because I'm religious, but because I'm serious about protecting what You've entrusted to me. I will not be like Samson, who played with sin until it cost him everything. I will be like Joseph, who ran from compromise even when it cost him his reputation. I declare that my calling is surrounded by walls of holiness. The enemy cannot penetrate. Sin cannot contaminate. Compromise cannot enter. I am protected by my consecration. I am shielded by my obedience. I am guarded by my commitment to purity. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen.

Removing Every Compromise That Creates Vulnerability: Lord, I ask You to expose every area of compromise in my life. Show me the hidden sins I've tolerated. Reveal the secret compromises I've justified. Uncover the areas where I've lowered my standards and opened doors to the enemy. I repent for every compromise—the "little" sins I thought didn't matter, the "harmless" entertainment I consumed, the relationships I knew weren't right, the conversations I participated in that didn't honor You. I repent for playing with fire and thinking I wouldn't get burned. I repent for flirting with temptation and thinking I could handle it. I repent for lowering the standard and calling it grace. Today, I remove every compromise. I cut off every ungodly relationship. I delete every app, unfollow every account, cancel every subscription that creates vulnerability in my life. I will not give the enemy a foothold. I will not leave the door cracked open. I will not play games with my calling. I close every door I opened through compromise. I seal every crack in my armor. I remove every vulnerability from my life. I am made whole. I am made pure. I am made strong. The enemy has no access. Sin has no power. Compromise has no place. I stand in holiness, and my calling is secure. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Declaring Protection Over the Calling Through Consecration: Father, I consecrate myself fully to You and to my calling. I set myself apart. I am not like everyone else. I am not living for the world's approval. I am not chasing the culture's standards. I am Yours, and I am holy because You are holy. I am a vessel of honor, sanctified and useful for the Master's work, prepared for every good work. I declare that my consecration is my protection. Because I am set apart, I am shielded. Because I am holy, I am guarded. Because I am consecrated, the enemy cannot touch me. My calling is protected by my purity. My anointing is preserved by my obedience. My assignment is secured by my holiness. I will not lose my calling like Saul. I will not lose my strength like Samson. I will not lose my anointing like the sons of Eli. I will finish well because I live holy. I will complete my assignment because I walk in purity. I will fulfill my calling because I am consecrated to the Lord. I am protected. I am preserved. I am prepared. And I will walk in the fullness of everything God has called me to do. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen and Amen.

DAY 6: HOLINESS INCREASES THE ANOINTING ON YOUR CALLING

Book Reflection:

The anointing doesn't flow through dirty vessels. Isaiah couldn't be commissioned until he was cleansed. The priests couldn't enter the Holy of Holies until they were sanctified. The greater the calling, the greater the holiness required. If you want more anointing, more power, more authority—you need more holiness. The anointing increases in proportion to your consecration. God doesn't pour new wine into old wineskins, and He doesn't pour fresh anointing on compromised vessels.

Scripture Reading:

2 Timothy 2:20-21 (NKJV)

"But in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay, some for honor and some for dishonor. Therefore if anyone cleanses himself from the latter, he will be a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Master, prepared for every good work."

Psalm 24:3-4 (NKJV)

"Who may ascend into the hill of the LORD? Or who may stand in His holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who has not lifted up his soul to an idol, nor sworn deceitfully."

Isaiah 52:11 (NKJV)

"Depart! Depart! Go out from there, touch no unclean thing; go out from the midst of her, be clean, you who bear the vessels of the LORD."

1 Corinthians 6:19-20 (NKJV)

"Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's."

Prayer Points:

1. Make a fresh commitment to the Lord to model holiness to the world—we are people of holiness.
2. Ask the Lord for fresh anointing as you walk in new levels of holiness.
3. Contemplate and reflect on the cross of Jesus that has made you holy. Holiness is not by works. It is by grace.
4. Pray and ask the Lord to keep our pastors and leaders holy for the call of God.

Consecrating as a Vessel of Honor: Father, I present myself to You as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable, which is my reasonable service. I am not my own—I was bought with a price, the precious blood of Jesus. Therefore, I consecrate my body, my mind, my heart, my hands, my feet, my mouth—everything—to You. Cleanse me from every dishonorable thing. Purify me from every defilement. Sanctify me and set me apart as a vessel of honor in Your house. I refuse to be a vessel of dishonor, used for common purposes. I refuse to be a compromised vessel that limits what You can do through me. I want to be useful for the Master's work. I want to be prepared for every good work. I want to be a vessel that carries Your glory, Your power, Your presence. So I separate myself from everything that contaminates. I remove myself from every unclean thing. I consecrate myself fully and completely to You. I am a vessel of honor. I am sanctified. I am set apart. I am useful for the Master. I am prepared for every good work. Use me, Lord. Fill me. Flow through me. I am Yours completely. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Asking for Fresh Anointing Through Sanctification: Lord, I hunger for a fresh anointing on my calling. I'm not satisfied with yesterday's anointing. I'm not content with where I am. I want more of You. I want more power. I want more authority. I want more of Your presence. And I know that the anointing flows through clean vessels. So I sanctify myself. I purify myself. I consecrate myself. I remove every hindrance. I cleanse every defilement. I separate myself from everything that blocks the flow of Your Spirit. Pour fresh oil on my life. Baptize me with fresh fire. Anoint me

with fresh power. Let the anointing that was on Elijah rest on me. Let the anointing that was on Isaiah rest on me. Let the anointing that was on the apostles rest on me. I want to see miracles. I want to see breakthroughs. I want to see the impossible become possible. And I know it won't happen through my own strength—it will happen through Your anointing. So I ask for more. I hunger for more. I consecrate myself for more. Anoint me afresh. Fill me again. Empower me anew. I receive a fresh anointing right now. Greater power. Greater authority. Greater manifestation of Your Spirit. I am anointed. I am empowered. I am filled. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen.

Declaring Greater Power Through Greater Holiness: Father, I declare that as I pursue holiness, the anointing on my life increases. As I walk in purity, Your power flows through me. As I consecrate myself, Your presence rests on me. I will not settle for a powerless Christianity. I will not accept a compromised anointing. I will not tolerate a limited manifestation of Your Spirit. I pursue holiness because I want more of You. I pursue purity because I want more power. I pursue consecration because I want more authority. And I declare that greater holiness leads to greater anointing. Greater purity leads to greater power. Greater consecration leads to greater manifestation. I will walk in holiness, and I will walk in power. I will live in purity, and I will see miracles. I will remain consecrated, and I will experience breakthrough. And I pray this not just for myself but for my entire church. Lord, raise up a generation of believers who are both holy and powerful. Raise up a people who walk in purity and operate in authority. Raise up a church that is consecrated and anointed. Let holiness and power flow together. Let purity and miracles go hand in hand. Let consecration and breakthrough be inseparable. We will be a holy people. We will be a powerful people. We will be a people who carry Your glory and change the world. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen and Amen.

DAY 7: PLEAD THE BLOOD OF JESUS OVER YOUR LIFE AND CALLING

Book Reflection:

CALLED PEOPLE ALWAYS EXPERIENCE AN ATTACK IN THE AREA OF THEIR CALLING

The enemy will always attack your calling, but we have a weapon that never fails—the blood of Jesus. When you plead the blood over your calling, you are declaring that your assignment is covered, protected, and empowered by the finished work of Christ. The blood speaks on your behalf and silences every accusation, every attack, and every assignment of hell against your destiny. This is not just symbolic language—this is spiritual warfare. The blood of Jesus is the most powerful force in the universe, and when you apply it to your calling, you are activating divine protection, supernatural favor, and unstoppable momentum. The enemy cannot penetrate what the blood has covered.

Scripture Reading:

Revelation 12:11 (NKJV)

"And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death."

Exodus 12:13 (NKJV)

"Now the blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you; and the plague shall not be on you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt."

Hebrews 12:24 (NKJV)

"to Jesus the Mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling that speaks better things than that of Abel."

1 John 1:7 (NKJV)

"But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin."

Prayer Points:

1. Plead the blood of Jesus over the call of God on your life.
2. Plead the blood of Jesus over your life.
3. Plead the blood of Jesus over our pastors and leaders.
4. Release the blood to break every curse.

Pleading the Blood Over My Calling:

Father, I plead the blood of Jesus over my calling right now. I cover every assignment You've given me with the precious blood of the Lamb. I declare that no weapon formed against my calling shall prosper. Every scheme of the enemy is canceled. Every demonic interference is broken. Every satanic assignment is nullified by the power of the blood. I plead the blood over my mind, my vision, my gifts, my relationships, my resources, and every door You've opened for me. The blood of Jesus speaks better things over my life than any curse, any attack, or any word spoken against me. I declare that my calling is covered by the blood and no weapon formed against it shall prosper. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Breaking Curses and Generational Limitations:

Lord, by the power of the blood of Jesus, I break every curse that has been spoken over my life and my calling. I break every generational pattern of failure, poverty, fear, and limitation. I cancel every satanic decree that says I will not fulfill my destiny. The blood of Jesus has redeemed me from the curse of the law and has set me free to walk in the fullness of everything You've called me to do. I declare that I am no longer bound by what held my ancestors back. I am a new creation in Christ, and the blood has made me free. I walk in freedom, favor, and the fullness of my calling. Every chain is broken. Every limitation is removed. Every door that was closed to previous generations is now open to me because of the blood. I declare breakthrough, acceleration, and supernatural favor over my calling. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 8: PLEADING THE BLOOD OF JESUS OVER ATTACKS ON YOUR CALLING.

Book Reflection:

YOUR CALLING WILL BE ATTACKED IN ITS INFANCY.

The enemy always tries to destroy calling in its infancy. Just as Pharaoh tried to kill all the Hebrew baby boys when Moses was born, and Herod tried to kill all the babies in Bethlehem when Jesus was born, the enemy will launch his most vicious attacks when your calling is just beginning to emerge. Why? Because he knows what you'll become if you survive.

Every attack you've faced—every betrayal, every setback, every disappointment—has been the enemy's attempt to abort your calling before it fully develops. But here's what you need to understand: The intensity of the attack is directly proportional to the significance of your calling. If the enemy is fighting you this hard, it's because he knows what's inside you. He knows what you're capable of. He knows the impact you'll have if you don't give up.

Scripture Reading:

Exodus 1:15-17, 22 (NIV)

- "The king of Egypt said to the Hebrew midwives, whose names were Shiphrah and Puah, 'When you are helping the Hebrew women during childbirth on the delivery stool, if you see that the baby is a boy, kill him; but if it is a girl, let her live.' The midwives, however, feared God and did not do what the king of Egypt had told them to do; they let the boys live... Then Pharaoh gave this order to all his people: 'Every Hebrew boy that is born you must throw into the Nile, but let every girl live.'"

Ephesians 6:12 (NKJV)

"For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places."

Prayer Points:

1. Plead the blood of Jesus and declare the finished work of the cross over your life, marriage, children, family, career and business.
2. Plead the blood of Jesus over your calling and declare victory over the attacks of the enemy against your calling.
3. Plead the blood of Jesus over Impact Church, Pastors and Leaders, Elders, iTeam, members and every person God will send our way in 2026.

Breaking Through Spiritual Opposition: Father, I take authority over every demonic attack against my calling. I declare that every plan of the enemy to abort my purpose is canceled in Jesus' name. The intensity of the warfare I've faced is proof of the significance of my calling. I will not be intimidated. I will not give up. Greater is He who is in me than he who is in the world.

Declaring Qualification Through the Blood: Lord, I declare that I am qualified for my calling—not because of my own righteousness, but because of the blood of Jesus. The blood has removed my filthy garments and clothed me with robes of righteousness. I stand before You justified, sanctified, and glorified. Every lie that says I'm not good enough is destroyed by the power of the blood. I am chosen. I am anointed. I am appointed. Just as Jesus said, "It is finished" on the cross, the blood declares that my assignment will be finished. Every plan the enemy has to stop me, delay me, or derail me is canceled by the blood. I plead the blood over my pastors and spiritual leaders—let the blood speak completion over their assignments. Let the blood silence every voice that says they won't make it, they won't finish, or they won't succeed. I declare that what God has started in them, He will complete. The blood testifies that they are overcomers, finishers, and victors. I cover every believer in this church with the blood and declare that we will all finish our race with joy and fulfill everything God has called us to do. The blood speaks, and it speaks victory, breakthrough, and completion. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen and Amen.

DAY 9: CONTINUE TO PLEAD THE BLOOD OF JESUS OVER YOUR LIFE AND CALLING.

Book Reflection:

The blood of Jesus is not silent—it speaks. While Abel's blood cried out for vengeance, Jesus' blood cries out for mercy, redemption, and completion. When the enemy accuses you and says you're not qualified, not ready, or not chosen, the blood speaks louder. It testifies on your behalf, declaring that you are called, chosen, anointed, and appointed by God Himself.

Scripture Reading:

Hebrews 12:24 (NKJV)

"to Jesus the Mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling that speaks better things than that of Abel."

Romans 8:33-34 (NKJV)

"Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us."

Zechariah 3:1-4 (NKJV)

3. Pray against any spiritual attacks on Impact Church and our leadership.

Silencing the Accuser: Father, I thank You that the blood of Jesus speaks on my behalf. Every accusation the enemy brings against me is silenced by the blood. When Satan says I'm not qualified, the blood says I am chosen. When he says I'm not ready, the blood says I am equipped. When he says I've failed too many times, the blood says I am redeemed and restored. I declare that no weapon formed against my calling shall prosper, and every tongue that rises against me in judgment shall be condemned. The blood of Jesus testifies that I am called according to Your purpose, and nothing can change that. I silence every voice of accusation, condemnation, and discouragement in the mighty name of Jesus. The blood speaks better things over my life and my calling. Amen.

DAY 10: THE BLOOD CLEANSSES AND QUALIFIES YOU FOR YOUR CALLING

Book Reflection:

You may not feel qualified for your calling, but the blood of Jesus has already qualified you. Every past mistake, every sin, every failure—the blood washes it all away and presents you spotless before God. The enemy wants you to live in condemnation and disqualification, but the blood removes every stain and declares you are clean, pure, and ready for your assignment.

Scripture Reading:

1 John 1:9 (NKJV)

"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Hebrews 10:19-22 (NKJV)

"Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh, and having a High Priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water."

Psalms 51:7 (NKJV)

"Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow."

2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV)

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new."

Prayer Points:

1. Thank God for your salvation through the shed blood of Jesus.
2. Thank God for your deliverance and freedom through the shed blood of Jesus.
3. Thank God for the many people who were saved, healed and delivered at Impact in 2025.
4. Thank God in advance for the many souls who will be saved, healed and delivered in 2026.

Removing Condemnation: Father, I thank You that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. The blood of Jesus has removed every stain, every sin, and every failure from my life. I refuse to live under the weight of guilt and shame. The enemy wants me to believe I'm disqualified because of my past, but the blood says I am forgiven, cleansed, and made new. I declare that my past does not define my future. My mistakes do not disqualify me from my calling. The blood has washed me whiter than snow, and I stand before You clean, pure, and ready for my assignment. I break every chain of condemnation off my life right now in the name of Jesus. I am free. I am forgiven. I am qualified by the blood. Amen.

Declaring Freedom from Past Mistakes: Lord, I bring every past mistake, every sin, and every failure to the cross. I confess them before You, and I receive Your forgiveness. The blood of Jesus cleanses me from all unrighteousness. I am not defined by what I did—I am defined by what Jesus did for me. The blood has made me a new creation. Old things have passed away, and all things have become new. I declare that my calling is not hindered by my past. The blood has removed every obstacle, every barrier, and every limitation. I step into my calling with confidence, knowing that I am fully forgiven, fully restored, and fully qualified. I pray for my pastors and leaders—let the blood remove every weight of past mistakes from their lives. Let them walk in the freedom and confidence that comes from knowing they are cleansed by the blood. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Stepping Into Calling with Confidence: Father, because of the blood of Jesus, I have boldness to enter the Holiest. I have access to Your presence, Your power, and Your purposes. The blood has sprinkled my heart clean from an evil conscience, and I no longer have to question whether I'm good enough. The blood says I am. I declare that I will step into my calling with full assurance of faith. I will not hesitate. I will not hold back. I will not disqualify myself. The blood

has qualified me, and that is enough. I pray for every believer in this church who struggles with feelings of inadequacy—let the blood wash away every lie and every insecurity. Let them see themselves the way You see them—clean, pure, qualified, and ready. I declare that we will all walk in the confidence that comes from being washed by the blood of Jesus. We are not disqualified. We are chosen. We are called. We are ready. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen and Amen.

DAY 11: RELEASE THE BLOOD OF JESUS TO WORK ON YOUR BEHALF.

Book Reflection:

The blood of Jesus is not silent—it speaks. While Abel's blood cried out for vengeance, Jesus' blood cries out for mercy, redemption, and completion. When the enemy accuses you and says you're not qualified, not ready, or not chosen, the blood speaks louder. It testifies on your behalf, declaring that you are called, chosen, anointed, and appointed by God Himself.

Scripture Reading:

Hebrews 12:24 (NKJV)

"to Jesus the Mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling that speaks better things than that of Abel."

Romans 8:33-34 (NKJV)

When Satan says I'm not qualified, the blood says I am chosen. When he says I'm not ready, the blood says I am equipped. DAY 12: ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT TO HELP YOU DISCOVER YOUR CALLING.

Book Reference:

DISCOVERING YOUR CALLING THROUGH YOUR DESIRES

One of the most misunderstood aspects of discovering your calling is the role of your desires. Many people have been taught to distrust their desires, to see them as selfish or carnal. But

Psalm 37:4 says, "Delight yourself in the LORD, and He will give you the desires of your heart." This doesn't just mean God will give you what you want—it means God will put His desires in your heart.

When you're walking closely with God, when you're delighting in Him, the desires you feel are often God speaking to you about your calling. That passion you have to help people, to create, to build, to teach, to heal—that's not random. That's God working in you, giving you the desire and the power to fulfill His good purpose. Your desires are clues to your calling.

Scripture Reading:

Psalm 37:4 (NKJV)

"Delight yourself also in the LORD, and He shall give you the desires of your heart."

Philippians 2:13 (NLT)

For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him."

Prayer Points:

1. Ask God to reveal your calling to you through the power of the Holy Spirit.
2. Ask God to cause your desires to align with the call of God on your life through the power of the Holy Spirit.
3. Ask God to reveal greater vision for Impact Church to our pastors and leaders through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Asking God to Reveal Calling Through Desires: Lord, reveal my calling to me through the desires You've placed in my heart. Help me discern which desires are from You and which are distractions. As I delight myself in You, align my heart with Your purposes. Give me clarity about what You're calling me to do, and let my desires be a compass pointing me toward my destiny.

Receiving Divine Desire: Father, work in me both to will and to do Your good pleasure. Give me a burning desire for the things You've called me to do. Let my passion for my calling be so strong that nothing can distract me or pull me away. Make me hungry for the assignment You've given me. Let my desires align perfectly with Your purposes.

Praying for Pastors' Vision: God, I pray for my pastors and spiritual leaders. Give them fresh vision and renewed passion for what You've called them to do. Reignite the fire in their hearts. Let them delight in You so deeply that Your desires become their desires. Protect them from burnout and discouragement. Surround them with people who will fan the flame of their calling.

DAY 13: ASK GOD TO CONFIRM YOUR CALLING THROUGH THE POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.

Book Reflection:

THE POWER OF SPIRITUAL SIGNS AND CONFIRMATION

God often confirms calling through supernatural signs, dreams, visions, and prophetic words. Throughout Scripture, we see God using spiritual signs to confirm what He's called people to do. Joseph had dreams that revealed his calling. Moses saw a burning bush. Gideon received multiple signs. Paul had a vision of a man from Macedonia. God knows that we need spiritual confirmation, especially when He's calling us to do something that seems impossible.

Don't despise spiritual signs. Don't dismiss prophetic words spoken over your life. God uses these things to confirm your calling and give you courage to step forward. If you've received prophetic words, dreams, or supernatural confirmations about your calling, write them down. Remember them. They will sustain you in seasons of doubt and difficulty.

Scripture Reading:

Acts 16:9-10 (NKJV)

"And a vision appeared to Paul in the night. A man of Macedonia stood and pleaded with him, saying, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us.' Now after he had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go to Macedonia, concluding that the Lord had called us to preach the gospel to them."

1 Samuel 3:19-20 (NIV)

"The LORD was with Samuel as he grew up, and he let none of Samuel's words fall to the ground. And all Israel from Dan to Beersheba recognized that Samuel was attested as a prophet of the LORD."

Prayer Points:

1. Give God thanks for past confirmations of your assignments and calling.
2. Ask God to confirm your calling to you through the power of the Holy Spirit.
3. Ask God to continue revealing and confirming a corporate calling for our church.

Asking for Spiritual Confirmation: Lord, confirm my calling through spiritual signs, dreams, visions, and prophetic words. Speak to me in ways I cannot deny or dismiss. Give me supernatural confirmation of what You've called me to do. Let none of Your words fall to the ground. I'm listening. I'm watching. I'm paying attention to what You're saying.

Thanksgiving for Past Confirmations: Father, I thank You for every prophetic word, every dream, every vision, every supernatural sign You've already given me about my calling. I will not forget them. I will not dismiss them. I receive them as confirmation from heaven. Use them to sustain me in seasons of doubt and to give me courage to keep moving forward.

DAY 14: PRAYING FOR REVELATION. GOD REVEAL THE GIFTS YOU'VE GIVEN ME FOR MY CALLING.

Book Reflection:

The gifts, talents, and abilities God has given you are not random—they're clues to your calling. Romans 12:6 says, "We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us." Your gifts are tools that God gave you to fulfill your assignment. If you're naturally good at something, if you have a talent that comes easily to you, if you have abilities that others don't have—pay attention. Those gifts are pointing you toward your calling.

God doesn't waste anything. He doesn't give you gifts just for fun. He gives you gifts because you're going to need them to fulfill your calling. Your spiritual gifts, your natural talents, your learned skills—all of these are part of your divine equipping. The question is: Are you using your gifts to fulfill your calling, or are you using them for something else?

Scripture Reading:

Romans 12:6-8 (NIV)

"We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully."

1 Peter 4:10 (NKJV)

"As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God."

Prayer Points:

1. Ask God to reveal your gifts to you.
2. Ask God to help you activate dormant gifts.
3. Ask God to give you the boldness, generosity and willingness to use your gifts to serve God at Impact Church.

Asking for Revelation of Gifts: Lord, reveal to me the gifts, talents, and abilities You've given me. Help me see what comes naturally to me that others struggle with. Show me the tools You've placed in my hands to fulfill my calling. Give me clarity about how my gifts connect to my assignment. Open my eyes to see what You've already equipped me with.

Serving with My Gifts: God, show me how to use my gifts to serve the vision of my local church. Help me identify where my gifts are most needed and where they can have the greatest impact. Give me a servant's heart and the humility to use what You've given me to build Your kingdom, not my own. Let my gifts be a blessing to my spiritual leaders and my church family.

DAY 15: PRAYING FOR GOD TO GIVE ME REVELATION. GOD REVEAL MY ASSIGNMENTS THROUGH MY HOLY FRUSTRATIONS.

Book Reflection:

Pay attention to the needs in the world that break your heart. Pay attention to your holy frustrations. Pay attention to your righteous anger. What needs do you see that others don't see? What problems do you find yourself always wrestling with in your heart? What injustices make you angry? Your calling will always be found at the intersection between your primary conviction and the world's needs.

Nehemiah's calling was revealed when he heard about the broken walls of Jerusalem and wept. Moses' calling was revealed when he saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew slave and couldn't stand by. Jesus' calling was revealed when He saw the multitudes and was moved with compassion. Your compassion is not random—it's a clue to your calling. What breaks your heart is what you're called to fix.

Scripture Reading:

Nehemiah 1:3-4 (NKJV)

"And they said to me, 'The survivors who are left from the captivity in the province are there in great distress and reproach. The wall of Jerusalem is also broken down, and its gates are burned with fire.' So it was, when I heard these words, that I sat down and wept, and mourned for many days; I was fasting and praying before the God of heaven."

Matthew 9:36 (NKJV)

"But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd."

Prayer Points:

1. Ask God to reveal and help you decode your holy frustrations. The agitations on your heart are saying something.
2. Ask God to give you divine compassion. Ask Him to sensitize your heart to feel what He feels.
3. Pray for the burden that God has laid upon your pastors to be revealed and carried out in the city of Boston and beyond.

Asking God to Reveal Needs: Lord, show me the needs in the world that I'm called to meet. Break my heart for what breaks Yours. Give me holy frustration over the problems I'm meant to solve. Let my compassion be a compass pointing me toward my calling. Open my eyes to see what others don't see and give me courage to respond.

Receiving Divine Compassion: Father, fill me with Your compassion for the people and causes You've called me to serve. Don't let me become numb or indifferent to the needs around me. Keep my heart tender and responsive. Give me the same compassion Jesus had when He saw the multitudes. Let my compassion move me to action.

Praying for Pastors' Burden: God, I pray for my pastors and spiritual leaders. Sustain the burden You've placed on their hearts for this city, this church, this generation. When they grow weary,

renew their compassion. When they feel overwhelmed by the needs, remind them that You've called and equipped them. Give them fresh vision for the people they're called to serve.

DAY 16: PRAYING FOR REVELATION. GOD MAKE ME A RADICAL DREAMER.

Book Reflection:

Every calling begins with a potential season—the season when God shows you the "what" but not yet the "how" or the "when." This is when you receive the dream, the vision, the promise. Joseph was seventeen years old when he received his dreams about his brothers' sheaves bowing down to his. He had no idea it would take thirteen years and include a pit, slavery, false accusation, and prison before he would see those dreams fulfilled.

The potential season is exciting, but it's also dangerous. The danger is telling the wrong people too soon. Joseph made the mistake of sharing his dreams with his brothers, and they threw him in a pit. Not everyone can handle your dream. Not everyone will celebrate your calling. Be careful who you share your vision with in the potential season.

Scripture Reading:

Genesis 37:5-8 (NKJV)

"Now Joseph had a dream, and he told it to his brothers; and they hated him even more. So he said to them, 'Please hear this dream which I have dreamed: There we were, binding sheaves in the field. Then behold, my sheaf arose and also stood upright; and indeed your sheaves stood all around and bowed down to my sheaf.' And his brothers said to him, 'Shall you indeed reign over us? Or shall you indeed have dominion over us?' So they hated him even more for his dreams and for his words."

Habakkuk 2:2-3 (NKJV)

"Then the LORD answered me and said: 'Write the vision and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it. For the vision is yet for an appointed time; but at the end it will speak, and it will not lie. Though it tarries, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry.'"

Prayer Points:

1. Pray and ask God to make you a radical dreamer. All great things begin with a dream.
2. Ask God for fresh vision and for wisdom to communicate the vision.
3. Pray for the vision of Impact Church: Impacting you to impact your world. Pray that many souls will be impacted by the preaching of the Gospel in Boston and beyond.

Receiving Fresh Vision: Lord, give me fresh vision for my calling. Show me the dream You have for my life. Let me see what You see. Give me clarity about the "what" even if I don't yet understand the "how" or the "when." Write the vision on my heart and make it so clear that I cannot deny it or forget it.

Wisdom About Sharing: Father, give me wisdom about who to share my vision with. Protect my dream from dream-killers and vision-stealers. Surround me with people who will celebrate what You're doing in my life, not criticize it. Help me discern who is safe and who is not. Give me the courage to guard my vision in this season.

Praying for Church Vision: God, I pray for the vision You've given my church and my spiritual leaders. Protect that vision from attack. Surround my pastors with people who will celebrate and support what You're building. Give them wisdom about when to share and when to guard. Let the vision You've given them come to pass in Your perfect timing.

DAY 17: PRAYING FOR REVELATION. GRACE TO MANAGE GREAT RESPONSIBILITY.

Book Reflection:

After thirteen years of pits, slavery, false accusations, and prison, Joseph's palace season came in one day. Pharaoh had a dream, and suddenly Joseph went from prisoner to prime minister. From prison to palace in twenty-four hours. This is the palace season—the season of sudden elevation, divine promotion, and great responsibility.

But here's what most people don't understand about the palace season: It's not just about elevation—it's about responsibility. Joseph wasn't promoted so he could live in luxury. He was promoted to save nations from famine. The palace season is not about you—it's about the people God has called you to serve. Your promotion is for a purpose.

Scripture Reading:

Genesis 41:14-15, 39-41 (NKJV)

"Then Pharaoh sent and called Joseph, and they brought him quickly out of the dungeon; and he shaved, changed his clothing, and came to Pharaoh. And Pharaoh said to Joseph, 'I have had a dream, and there is no one who can interpret it. But I have heard it said of you that you can understand a dream, to interpret it.'... Then Pharaoh said to Joseph, 'Inasmuch as God has shown you all this, there is no one as discerning and wise as you. You shall be over my house, and all my people shall be ruled according to your word; only in regard to the throne will I be greater than you.' And Pharaoh said to Joseph, 'See, I have set you over all the land of Egypt.'"

Luke 12:48 (NKJV)

"For everyone to whom much is given, from him much will be required; and to whom much has been committed, of him they will ask the more."

Prayer Points:

1. Thank God for the great responsibilities He has given you.
2. Ask God to give you the humility and the grace to steward well.
3. Thank God for the many blessings He has given us to touch many people as Impact Church.
4. Ask God to make you a faithful builder of the Kingdom at Impact Church and beyond.

Thanksgiving for Promotion: Father, I thank You that my palace season is coming. Thank You that You're preparing me for elevation. I receive divine promotion by faith. I declare that what took Joseph thirteen years will not take me that long. You are a God of suddenly, and I believe You can accelerate my timeline. Prepare me for the responsibility that comes with promotion.

Staying Humble in Success: Lord, help me stay humble when You elevate me. Don't let success make me forget the pit and the prison. Keep me grateful, dependent on You, and focused on serving others. Remind me that promotion is not about me—it's about the people You've called me to serve. Let me use my influence for Your glory, not my own.

Serving the Vision of My Church: God, as You elevate me, help me use my influence to serve the vision of my local church. Let my promotion be a blessing to my spiritual leaders and my church family. Give me wisdom to steward my platform well and to always point people back to You. Help me remember that I'm promoted to serve, not to be served.

DAY 18: PRAYING FOR FAITH.

Book Reflection:

Your calling will require faith—the kind of faith that makes you step out of the boat when Jesus says, "Come." Peter was the only disciple who walked on water that day because he was the only one willing to get out of the boat. The other disciples stayed safe, stayed comfortable, stayed in the boat. But Peter experienced a miracle that none of them experienced because he was willing to take a risk.

Your calling will require you to do things that don't make sense. It will require you to step out when you can't see the whole staircase. It will require you to move forward when everyone around you thinks you're crazy. But that's what faith is—taking God at His word even when circumstances say otherwise. The price of your calling is faith, and you must be willing to pay it.

Scripture Reading:

Matthew 14:28-29 (NKJV)

"And Peter answered Him and said, 'Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water.' So He said, 'Come.' And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus."

Hebrews 11:6 (NKJV)

"But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him."

Prayer Points:

1. Ask God to give you bold faith to step out of the boat and pursue your calling.

2. Pray and break the bondage of fear over your life in Jesus name.
3. Pray for fresh boldness and faith over our pastors and leaders. May they step into new territories and continue to break out of their comfort zone in Jesus name.

Receiving Bold Faith: Lord, give me the faith to step out of the boat. Give me the courage to take risks for You. I refuse to let fear keep me from my calling. When You say "Come," I will come. When You say "Go," I will go. I choose faith over fear, obedience over comfort, and Your voice over the voices of doubt.

Breaking Through Fear of Failure: Father, I break every chain of fear that has held me back from stepping into my calling. I refuse to let the fear of failure keep me in the boat. Even if I sink, You will catch me. Even if I fail, You will lift me up. I would rather fail trying than succeed at playing it safe. Give me the faith to attempt great things for You.

Praying for Church Leadership: God, I pray for my pastors and spiritual leaders. Give them bold faith to step out when You call them to do something that seems impossible. Protect them from the fear of man and the fear of failure. Surround them with people who will encourage them to take risks for Your kingdom. Let them lead us with faith that inspires us to step out of our own boats.

DAY 19: PRAY FOR THE SPIRIT OF DISCIPLINE.

Book Reflection:

Discipline is the bridge between your calling and your destiny. You can have the right calling, the right gifts, the right opportunities—but without discipline, you'll never reach your full potential. Discipline means saying no to good things so you can say yes to great things. It means sacrificing what you want now for what you want most.

Your calling will require you to be disciplined in your schedule, your finances, your relationships, your habits. It will require you to say no to distractions, no to comfort, no to things that others can do but you can't afford to do. Discipline is not punishment—it's the pathway to freedom. It's what enables you to finish what you started.

Scripture Reading:

1 Corinthians 9:24-27 (NKJV)

"Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it. And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a perishable crown, but we for an imperishable crown. Therefore I run thus: not with uncertainty. Thus I fight: not as one who beats the air. But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified."

Proverbs 25:28 (NKJV)

"Whoever has no rule over his own spirit is like a city broken down, without walls."

Prayer Points:

1. Ask God to give you divine and supernatural discipline to carry out your calling.
2. Pray and break the spirit of laziness, fatigue, anxiety and depression over your life.
3. Ask God to give you fresh zeal, tenacity, enthusiasm and passion to serve at Impact Church.
4. Pray for the ministries of Impact Church. For the hand of God to be upon everything we do!

Receiving Divine Discipline: Lord, give me the discipline I need to fulfill my calling. Help me say no to distractions and yes to my assignment. Give me self-control in every area of my life—my time, my money, my relationships, my habits. I choose discipline over comfort. I choose delayed gratification over instant pleasure. Strengthen me to run my race with endurance.

Breaking Through Laziness: Father, I break every chain of laziness, procrastination, and lack of discipline. I refuse to let my lack of self-control disqualify me from my calling. Give me the strength to do what I need to do even when I don't feel like it. Help me build habits that support my calling and break habits that hinder it.

Serving with Excellence: God, help me serve the vision of my church with discipline and excellence. Let me be faithful in the small things so You can trust me with greater things. Give me the discipline to show up consistently, serve wholeheartedly, and give my best in everything I do. Let my discipline inspire others to pursue their own calling with the same commitment.

DAY 20: PRAY FOR THE RIGHT PARTNERS, TEAM AND PEOPLE.

Book Reflection:

You cannot fulfill your calling alone. God never intended for you to do it by yourself. Every person in Scripture who accomplished something significant had a team. Moses had Aaron, Hur, and Joshua. David had his mighty men. Jesus had His disciples. Paul had Barnabas, Silas, Timothy, and others. Your calling requires the right people around you.

But here's the key: You must be intentional about building your team. Not everyone who wants to be on your team should be on your team. You need people who share your vision, who complement your weaknesses, who are committed to the mission, and who will tell you the truth. The right team will multiply your impact. The wrong team will sabotage your calling.

Scripture Reading:

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 (NIV)

"Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? Though

one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken."

Exodus 18:17-18 (NKJV)

"So Moses' father-in-law said to him, 'The thing that you do is not good. Both you and these people who are with you will surely wear yourselves out. For this thing is too much for you; you are not able to perform it by yourself.'"

Prayer Points:

1. Ask God for divine connections with the right people who He has assigned for your calling.
2. Ask God for the wisdom to build the right team.
3. Pray for the unity of our leadership and the people of Impact Church. Break the spirit of gossip, dissension, jealousy, rebellion and malice.

Asking for Divine Connections: Lord, send me the right people to help me fulfill my calling. Give me divine connections with people who share my vision and complement my weaknesses. Protect me from wrong relationships and open doors to right relationships. Surround me with people who will sharpen me, challenge me, and help me become everything You've called me to be.

Wisdom in Building a Team: Father, give me wisdom to build the right team. Help me discern who should be on my team and who should not. Give me courage to make difficult decisions about relationships. Teach me how to lead well, delegate effectively, and empower others. Let my team multiply my impact and advance Your kingdom.

Praying for the Church Leadership Team: God, I pray for the leadership team of my church. Strengthen the unity among them. Give them one heart and one vision. Protect them from division, offense, and misunderstanding. Anoint them to work together with excellence and love. Let their partnership be a model of kingdom collaboration that inspires the entire church.

DAY 21: FINISHING YOUR RACE WITH JOY—YOUR CALLING AWAITS

Book Reflection:

You've made it to the end of this journey, but this is not the end—it's the beginning. Everything you've learned, everything you've prayed, everything God has spoken to you over these 21 days has been preparing you for this moment. Your calling awaits. The world is waiting for you. People are waiting for what you carry. It's time to go.

Your calling is not asking you to be perfect. It's asking you to be obedient. It's asking you to take the first step. It's asking you to trust the One who called you. You don't need to see the whole staircase—you just need to take the first step. And here's what I can promise you: When you step out in obedience to your calling, God will meet you there. He'll meet you with His grace, His

anointing, His resources, His angels, His people, His wisdom, and His strength. You have everything you need. Now go and fulfill the assignment He gave you.

Scripture Reading:

2 Timothy 4:7-8 (NKJV)

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing."

Hebrews 12:1-2 (NKJV)

"Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

Philippians 3:13-14 (NKJV)

"Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

Prayer Points:

1. Rejoice, thank God because He has answered your prayers—Declare the work done!
2. Make a commitment that you are stepping into your calling in 2026.
3. Sign up to serve at Impact Church as a declaration of taking a step towards your calling.
4. Speak blessings over our pastors and church leadership.

Declaring Completion: Lord, I declare that I will finish my race with joy. I will not quit. I will not give up. I will not be distracted. I will run with endurance the race You've set before me. I will fight the good fight. I will keep the faith. And when I stand before You, I will hear You say, "Well done, good and faithful servant." I receive the crown of righteousness that is laid up for me.

Stepping Into Calling: Father, I step into my calling today with boldness, with faith, with joy. I refuse to let fear hold me back. I refuse to let doubt stop me. I refuse to let the opinions of others distract me. You have called me, and I will answer that call. I take the first step today, trusting that You will illuminate the next step. I'm ready. It's my time. It's my season. Let's go.

Blessing Over Pastors and Church: God, I release a blessing over my pastors and spiritual leaders. Thank You for their faithfulness to their calling. Strengthen them to finish their race with joy. Give them fresh vision, renewed passion, and supernatural endurance. Protect them from burnout and discouragement. Surround them with people who will celebrate them, support them, and help them fulfill everything You've called them to do. Let our church be a place where

callings are discovered, developed, and deployed for Your glory. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen and Amen.

FINAL CHARGE:

You have completed 21 days of fasting and seeking God for your calling. Now it's time to act. Your calling is not just something you pray about—it's something you walk in. Take what God has shown you and put it into action. Write down your calling. Share it with your spiritual leaders. Take the first step. Serve your church. Use your gifts. Walk in your anointing. Build your team. Stay consistent. Finish strong.

The world is waiting for you. People are waiting for what you carry. Your generation needs what God has placed inside you. Don't waste another day. Don't wait for perfect conditions. Don't wait until you feel ready. Step out in faith today.
